

Pass/No Pass classes

A policy change for the 2007 fall semester allowed for specific courses in the MBA program to be graded with Pass/No Pass (P/NP) grade, rather than a letter grade. These courses are experiential learning courses, such as project courses and study abroad classes. Each course has been reviewed and approved by the Management Policy Committee for inclusion in the curriculum as a P/NP course. If a course is offered with P/NP grading, all students in the course will be graded with either a Pass (P) or Not Pass (NP). Faculty cannot assign letter grades for the course. Only courses below the 60000-level can be designated P/NP.

MBA students: The policy allows MBA students to use up to six (6) credit hours of the approved courses to meet the graduation requirement of 60 credit hours. Students must take at least 54 credit hours of courses that are graded with a letter grade in order to meet graduation requirements.

MSHRM students: The policy allows MSHRM students to use up to six (6) credit hours of the approved courses to meet the graduation requirement of 61 credit hours (63 credit hours for May 2011 graduates). Students must take at least 55 (57 for May 2011 graduates) credit hours of courses that are graded with a letter grade in order to meet graduation requirements.

MSIA students: The policy allows MSIA students to use up to five (5) credit hours of approved courses to meet the graduation requirement of 48 credit hours. Students must take at least 43 credit hours of courses that are graded with a letter grade in order to meet graduation requirements.

MSF students: The policy allows MSF students to use up to four (4) credit hours of approved courses to meet the graduation requirement of 40 credit hours. Since the MSF curriculum is structured so that there may not be 4 credits of electives, in most cases, MSF students will take only 1 or 2 credits of pass/no pass coursework, if any.

The following courses are approved for P/NP grading as of fall semester 2010. Check with the Master's Student Services office for an updated list:

Classes in other departments may only be taken with a P/NP grade option with instructor and departmental approval. However, they cannot count towards the Krannert Master's degree.
