### Management Upper Division Admission Requirements

Courses in bold type and outlined can be taken only after a student is admitted to Upper Division Industrial Management. Each semester, the record of students who have completed all courses in the Management Admissions Index (\*MAI), have at least a 2.85 MAI and 2.40 GPA, have a "C" or higher in all MAI and School of Management courses, have completed their science requirement (see Note B on back), and are not on probation will be automatically admitted to Upper Division Industrial Management. Students with at least a 2.60 MAI who do not meet all of the additional requirements listed above will be reviewed by the Faculty Undergraduate Admissions Committee to determine whether space is available and sufficient cause exists to be admitted to the Upper Division Industrial Management.

## NOTES

- A.** The Management Admissions Index (MAI) is a weighted average (the weights being the semester credits assigned to each course) of the grades earned in the following courses: MA 16100/16500 & 16200/16600, or equivalent; MGMT 20000; CS 23500; ECON 25100; ENGL 10600 or equivalent; and COM 11400. These courses are indicated by the notation \*MAI.
- B.** Any two (8 hrs. min.) of the following: CHM 11500, 11600, 12300, 12400, PHYS 17200, 21800, 21900, 22000, 22100, 24100, 25100, 26100. (C grades or higher) The science electives must be completed prior to admission to the upper division of Industrial Management.
- C.** **General education elective courses** in sociology/psychology, world history, fine arts, literature, and international issues must be selected from approved lists maintained by the Management Advising Office and listed below. Contact your advisor with alternate courses that meet these criteria.
- D. Minors:** Five applied science minor approved courses (15 hours min.) in one of the areas: biology, chemistry, computer science, economic honors, engineering, earth and atmospheric sciences, management information systems, manufacturing management, mathematics, operations management, physics or quantitative methods. Refer to <http://www.krannert.purdue.edu/undergraduate> for a complete list of course descriptions and minor requirements. Minors outside of Krannert are options.
- E. ECON 51100, 51200, 51300, 51400, 51500, OBHR 30000, MGMT 32300 and 45500 are no credit.**
- F.** An elective consists of three hours of approved course credit or combination of 1 and 2 credit hour courses = 3 hours.

### General Information

\* General education courses may not be offered every semester

- MGMT, OBHR and ECON courses numbered 30000 or higher can only be taken after being admitted to the Upper Division.
- MGMT, OBHR and ECON courses cannot be taken online or by correspondence.
- Transfer credit for upper level MGMT, OBHR and ECON courses will only be considered if taken at a 4 year AACSB accredited school ([www.aacsb.edu](http://www.aacsb.edu)).
- Courses taken on approved Purdue study abroad programs may be used to satisfy general education, major, minor, and in some cases courses that must be taken at Purdue, West Lafayette. Schedule an appointment with your advisor to discuss study abroad opportunities.
- Credit earned for internship experience cannot be used to satisfy degree requirements.

**Optional Concentrations:** The following concentrations are available, but not required, for industrial management majors: Accounting, Analytical Consulting, Economics, Finance, International Business, Management Information Systems, Marketing, Organizational Behavior/Human Resources, Operations Management and Strategic Management.
